Cesar Leines is an expert in antitrust law and policy, regulation, and law & economics. He is currently an associate researcher at the International Center for Political and Social Studies AIP (CIEPS) in Panama.

He was appointed as Professor of Law at Tecnológico de Monterrey, Mexico and worked as UNESCO researcher for the Basque Competition Authority in Bilbao, Spain. Additionally, he was a visiting research scholar at several universities including Fordham University in New York City, University of Milano-Bicocca in Italy, KU Leuven in Belgium and Deusto University in Spain.

He holds an LL.B. from the Autonomous University of the State of Hidalgo, Mexico, and a master's degree (LL.M.) in International Economic and Business Law from the Rijksuniversiteit Groningen in the Netherlands. He was awarded the Ph.D. Law degree from University of Southampton in the United Kingdom.
